
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Why Humans Share Food

Beidelman,1997 In The Cool Knife T O Beidelman analyzes in rich detail the ritual imagery and symbolism of Kaguru initiations relating them to other Kaguru ceremonies as well as to more routine daily activities He argues that initiation educates boys and girls in their gender roles and constructs an ethnic identity that is assuming greater importance to the Kaguru as outside pressures threaten to undermine their culture The first ethnography that examines both male and female initiations in an African society in equal detail the book describes how Kaguru elders teach novices to value ambiguity and wordplay to understand the body and its appetites and to practice a complex etiquette that regulates daily behavior Built up from the manifold experiences and cues of everyday Kaguru routine the ritual provides initiates with a
